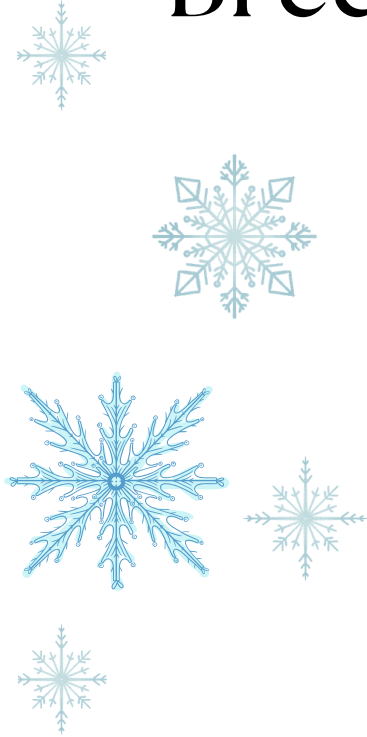

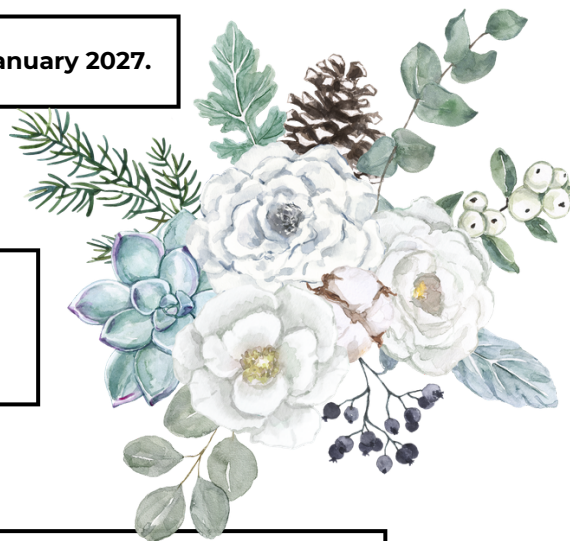

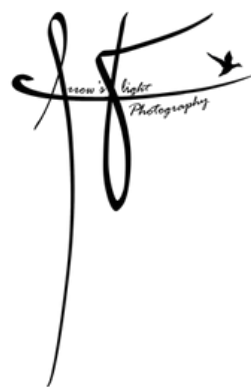

AGM Reports

NZSPBS AGM Presidents Report 2026

It is with pleasure and respect that I submit my fifth President's Report for the NZSPBS. Thank you, to society members, as well as the committee for supporting me in this role to protect, preserve and represent the NZSPBS and to promote the Shetland pony breed here in New Zealand.

I would like to acknowledge the hard working and supportive committee members. They give many hours of their voluntary time to further the society and complete the many administrative duties involved in each of their roles. I value and appreciate each of you and your significant support and how we can pull together as a united team to get things done.

In the interests of removing barriers and saving growing fuel costs we now are holding our monthly NZSPBS Committee meetings online using Google Meet. This is going well and I am proud of everyone for taking this big step, utilising the technology we have available.

Thank you to everyone who has entered and supported a show with a Shetland Section this season. Thank you for your effort and costs you have incurred. Entries have been small across the country at all shows but most have been supported. I think Nelson A&P was the only one that I am aware had no Shetland entries. Due to the loss of a long held show secretary in South Canterbury, several shows have changed their format where a traditional Shetland section has not been run but hopefully in time and with support from those affected by this, it can change. A reminder that shows can apply to the society for ribbon sponsorship if they run their Shetland Section under NZSPBS guidelines. Contact Lesley Lewis our Secretary and she had the guidelines readily available. Every year these are shared to shows through out New Zealand and the RAS along with judging guidelines to support judges not familiar or confident with the breed characteristics and qualities.

Another significant change which I must draw your attention to is the important change in animal welfare regulations that will affect horse, pony, and donkey owners across New Zealand.

From 9 May 2026 hot branding of horses, ponies, and donkeys will no longer be lawful under any circumstances.

On 9 May 2021 amendments to the Animal Welfare (Care and Procedures) Regulations 2018 prohibited hot branding of animals generally (as per regulation 55L [Prohibition on hot branding of animals generally]). However, regulation 55M [Hot branding of horses, ponies, and donkeys] allowed the practice of hot branding horses, ponies, and donkeys to continue for five years under controlled conditions.

Continued - NZSPBS AGM Presidents Report 2026

On 9 May 2026 this exception will no longer apply and will be automatically revoked, making the hot branding of any animal in all circumstances illegal.

Under regulation 55K of the regulations [Freeze branding cattle beasts or equids], the freeze branding of equids continues to be allowed by a person who is experienced with or has received training in the correct use of the method used, and who is able to recognise early signs of significant distress, injury, or ill-health so that they can take prompt remedial action or seek advice.

Most breeders have already made the transition to microchipping their ponies with some choosing to do further DNA typing to ensure identification in the longer term.

In closing I want to acknowledge each one of you for your contribution and commitment towards the continued success and sustainability of the NZSPBS.

We ended our financial year (31 st December 2025) with a surplus of \$794. Our total equity is \$18,901.

Membership has dipped below 50 and we now have 45 members. This will mean a decrease of income as membership subscriptions are our main income source. However, at present I can't see this as a reason to increase subscriptions.

NZSPBS AGM Registrars Report May 2026

As of today there are 1256 Shetland ponies on our Register. Fifteen foals were registered in the last year. Numbers of foals are steady in the teens.

Thank you to breeders for doing the mundane things we ask you to do such as the Annual returns. We do use the information and it is very valuable.

With the Amendments in the Animal Welfare (Care and Procedures) Regulations, hot iron branding is now illegal as of 9th May 2026. Freeze branding is still permitted. Now that MPI have made their position clear, we are working on new registration procedures to adapt to these new rules.

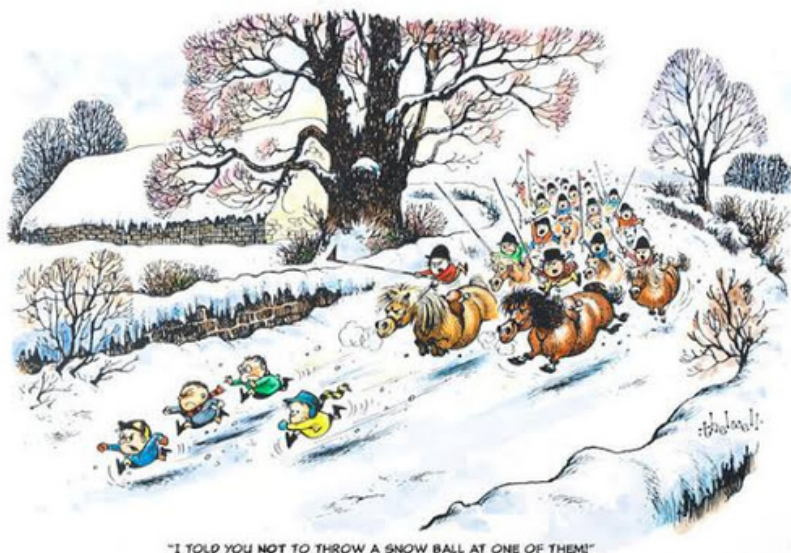
NZSPBS AGM Area Representatives - Lower North Island Report 2026

"Double H Citrus Liqueur was born in 2020 during the COVID years, jet black from day one and full of spirit. As a foal, she was shown twice at local A&P shows, winning Champion Youngstock at Oxford A&P while her dam, Burravoe Zesbrie (Zest), claimed Supreme Champion at both shows. Looking back, it felt like a passing of the torch.

Citrus has certainly followed in her mother's footsteps. As a two-year-old, she became Supreme Champion at the South Island Shetland Pony Show. In the 2025/26 season, she was awarded the New Zealand Shetland Pony of the Year title and added another South Island Shetland Show Supreme Championship to her record, this time under international judges.

Citrus' Dam is a two-time New Zealand Shetland Pony of the Year. When it came time to breed Zest's first foal, we chose the outstanding stallion Llewellyn Moritz, whose progeny we had long admired. The result was Citrus.

Her name continues the "Zest" theme established by her dam. Citrus Liqueur became the perfect fit and today represents the foundation of a family line that I hope will continue through future generations, including her younger brother, Double H Valencia, a rising 2-Year-old Colt.
