He really epitomized the Shetland breed by meeting and greeting everyone and doing a tour of the traders stands. Just about every post on Facebook from Equifest included wee Pickles, decked out in Dunstan Pink.

There will be a heap more Shetland fans out there now thanks to Pickles and Lucy. But he is not just an ambassador for the breed, he has also had a clean sweep of the Supreme Champion Shetland ribbons this season and put his best hoof forward in the open Unity ring at Waikato A&P where he lined up with all the show ponies and hacks and held his own. The needles had to stay in for 18 minutes so it gave the vet time to make friends with my other two wee Shetlands (who were busy playing chase with each other around the yard) and she fast became a Shetland convert. So many people have the impression that Shetlands are not to be trusted and are just obnoxious wee things that kick and bite, but my three certainly proved the opposite. She loved her Shetland kisses and we are both looking forward to tracking Sateen's health issues and learning how acupuncture can help.

Hope all is going well with the breeding season. There have been some lovely foal pictures popping up which proves that the breed is still going strong.

I was asked if Pickles could come to work in the Dunstan Marquee at Equifest, and we certainly surprised a lot of people when they discovered that we had a Shetland on our stand. We were not sure how it would go and if Pickles would be a bit upset about being there but in true Pickles fashion, he took it





all in his stride and just loved every bit of fuss that was made of him, with the added bonus of Dunstan Treats all day, for 3 days! Pickles made regular visits to trade stands to be pampered, massaged, draped in jewellery and even a visit to the Gin Stand!. He really did show the true nature of a Shetland and was just the best boy with all the children having their photos taken with him in the Dunstan picture frame and being so gentle even with the littlest child. He was a true Shetland ambassador and his photo popped up on many social media pages throughout Equifest giving many people their first introduction to the wonderful Shetland breed.

After Equifest he had a day at the Kihikihi Pony Club Ribbon Day with his number 1 fan Evelyn winning a handful of ribbons.

Then it was on to the Waikato A&P Show where, much to Lucy's delight Pickles won Supreme Champion Shetland for the 2nd year running, a trophy that Pickles sire "Gleneagles Phantom" had also won 8 years earlier. She was also placed in the Unity class. This is a class open to all handlers 10 years and over. It is judged by 2 judges on 4 different criteria's: Dress of Handler 20 points, Turn Out and Gear 20 points, Confirmation 30 points, Workout, paces, manners 30 points.

Entered in this class were a variety of show hacks, show ponies and hunters plus little Pickles. A total of 11 competitors. After the inspection of handler, gear and pony confirmation, they then had to do the work out. Lucy was extremely lucky to win the Junior with the most



points. For the final placings Lucy and Pickles were then given 6th place overall. Not bad for a little Shetland up against the bigger horses.

Next was the Clevedon A&P Show. With a clash of events for Lucy's show ponies we made a mad dash from an event at Taupo getting home at 9pm, put the show ponies to bed and got Pickles in, cleaned him up and headed to the Clevedon A&P Show at 5.30

the next morning! It was certainly worth the crazy driving cross country as Lucy and Pickles won Supreme Shetland Pony again at the show.

We truly are lucky to have this pony here at home and cannot thank Richard and Deanna enough for breeding such a special pony.

#### NORTH CLOSE McDHUI 104NZ Born 1.12.1990

Bred by North Close Shetland Pony Stud Sire: Shady Glen David (Imp Aust) 96NZ Dam: Thorpeville Gidget (Imp Aust) 62NZ Owned by Ann and Tiffany Storms

McDhui stood as a stallion for many years, and then as a gelding he went on to teach many children to ride and was also broken to harness. Tiffany and McDhui started their show career by winning Most Versatile Pony at their first outing and backed this up with another Most Versatile Pony trophy at the Northern Region Shetland Pony Show. Tiff and McDhui were regularly in the prizemoney in Handy Pony, Long Reining, Obstacle and Tip and Out in-hand Jumping. They also competed under saddle in flat and hunter jumping competitions. Tiffany and McDhui also won the NZSPBS National Junior Handler competition in 2012.

McDhui was crowned Woolliest Pony at the Franklin Winter Woollies Show in 2014—he was rather impressive in his long curly Cushings coat. Now happily retired with his Shetland paddock mate, Burravoe Randolph, he is still first to call out and trot over when he spies his people. His Cushings has been stable for a few years now and he loves his twice daily feeds.

Editor's Note - some history on the North Close stud.

North Close is one of our very early studs. Established by Marion and the late Roy Lusby of Cambridge. They imported Thorpeville Gidget (Imp Aust) 62NZ & Thorpeville Erika (Imp Aust) 63NZ. Erika was imported in foal to Musketeer of Wetherden and the foal North Close Eliza (IID) 94NZ went on to leave her genetics in the Cotswold "E" line which included multiple champion Cotswold Royal Ensign 378NZ who went on to sire many successful champions. His full sister Cotswold Esmeralda 247NZ was the dam of Duncree Eclipse 486NZ.

Pony visiting over and it was off inside for morning tea with my Mum.







